Fleet Watch

Purpose: Fleet Watch vehicles are highly visible mobile radio units which act as a crime deterrent, thus providing an added degree of safety for the citizens of North Carolina. Fleet Watch will provide the citizens of North Carolina with an alternate means of communicating with emergency services.

Explanation of the Program

1. Fleet Watch is a local effort involving companies, local law enforcement and Crime Control and Public Safety.
2. Each person involved in Fleet Watch is an additional set of eyes and ears for local law enforcement officials.
3. Participants in Fleet Watch are encouraged to notify Law Enforcement via radio or cell phone if they come upon anything of a suspicious nature, an accident, or a child in trouble or need, if approached by a citizen.
4. Participants in Fleet Watch are NOT to physically intervene in a situation.

Role of Fleet Watch Participant

Radio or cell phone should be used to notify police of any listed activity, or anything you feel needs immediate attention from Law Enforcement.

1. Describe exactly what is happening or has happened.
2. Give the location of the incident.
3. Describe if the incident is happening now, has just happened, or occurred some time ago.
4. Advise if there are any injuries, and to what extent.
5. Provide a description of the suspect/suspect vehicle.
6. Advise if the suspect fled the scene, in what direction, and by what means of travel.
7. If reporting suspicious activity, describe why the person or activity appears to be suspicious.
8. If a child should approach a Fleet Watch vehicle and request assistance, stay with the child until assistance arrives from Law Enforcement, and avoid placing the child in your vehicle unless absolutely necessary for the safety and comfort of the child.
9. On accidents, indicate if there are injuries, the extent, road blockage, chemical spills, and the exact location.
