



The Governor's Crime Commission Offers Free Internet/Social Networking Safety Courses for Parents, College Students, Teens, Tweens and Children.

Cyber-Safe Kids, Cyber-Savvy Teens is an instructional presentation for parents who are interested in learning about the dangers of the internet and social networking and how to protect their children. This course is designed for parents with little knowledge on how the internet works as well as those who have extensive computer skills.

Cyber Safety for Middle School/Tweens targets those children who require less supervision than a child when using a computer. Tweens are taught the dangers of being targeted on-line by predators, bullies and other groups/individuals and given the tools on how to report these threats as well as how to avoid becoming a target. The course also teaches tweens on how to protect their identity against identity theft.

Internet Safety: What You Don't Know Can Hurt You instructs teens on the dangers of Social Networking, Sexting, Cyberbullying, and On-Line Predators. Videos made by teen victims of on-line predators are shown as part of this course. Teens are provided with the tools necessary to protect themselves from these dangers as well as the criminal ramifications of Sexting and the consequences of cyberbullying.

Internet/Social Networking Safety for College Students targets college students and the dangers that they still face from on-line predators, on-line stalkers and cyberbullying and the tactics they can use as adults to minimize victimization. It focuses on the contents of their social networking pages and how these pages can set them up to be victims.
